Fitzroy's main heart is Brunswick Street but the real fun is to be had wandering down this gentrified suburb's various laneways discovering street art. Urban Scrawl Tours (urbanscrawl.com.au) will show you some of the best.

Industry Beans (industrybeans.com), a café and top brunch spot in a warehouse conversion, offers deconstructed, petal-strewn dishes and speciality drip, aeropress, filter and espresso coffee.

When it comes to drinking, Satan has all the best bars and **Naked for Satan** (nakedforsatan.com.au) – inspired by the pintxo bars of northern Spain is no exception. Naked in the Sky is the name of its rooftop bar and restaurant. Sunning on the terrace while gazing out over corrugated roofs and city skyscrapers, is my idea of a perfect Fitzroy afternoon. The food up here is also Basque inspired, but generally more substantial, while the list of on-tap beers and ciders includes some interesting, lesser-known drops.

Cutler & Co (cutlerandco.com.au) is the most prestigious of Andrew McConnell's knockout Melbourne restaurants, as hot today as when it hit the scene in 2009. I love the way this place just gets it; from the faultless wine list, to the attentive yet unobtrusive service, to a striking interior that marries the building's gritty industrial past with its sophisticated present.
